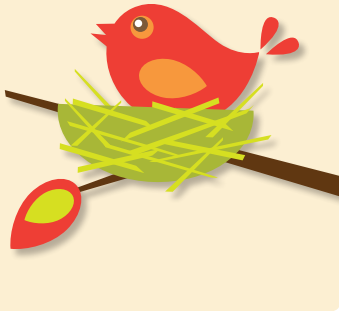

AGENCY ENDOWMENT SPOTLIGHT It All Adds Up!

Just ask the Gunnison Arts Center (GAC)! The staff and Board of the GAC started a small permanent (agency) endowment with a few modest contributions several years ago. Over time, those original funds have grown while the GAC has set aside small amounts each year. Not an easy task for a rural nonprofit with a small budget! 2016 brought a bitter-sweet gift. Long-time local arts supporter, Sue MacAllister, passed away after a short battle with cancer. In her will, Sue left a gift to the GAC Endowment that grew the fund to more than the target permanent amount of \$175,000. What does that mean? The endowment can now make distributions and will forever benefit the GAC and the community by continuing to grow and earning investment income that can be used for programming and operations. Endowments are a great way to create a reliable funding stream for any small nonprofit. You don't have to raise millions to save a little and have a big impact well into the future.

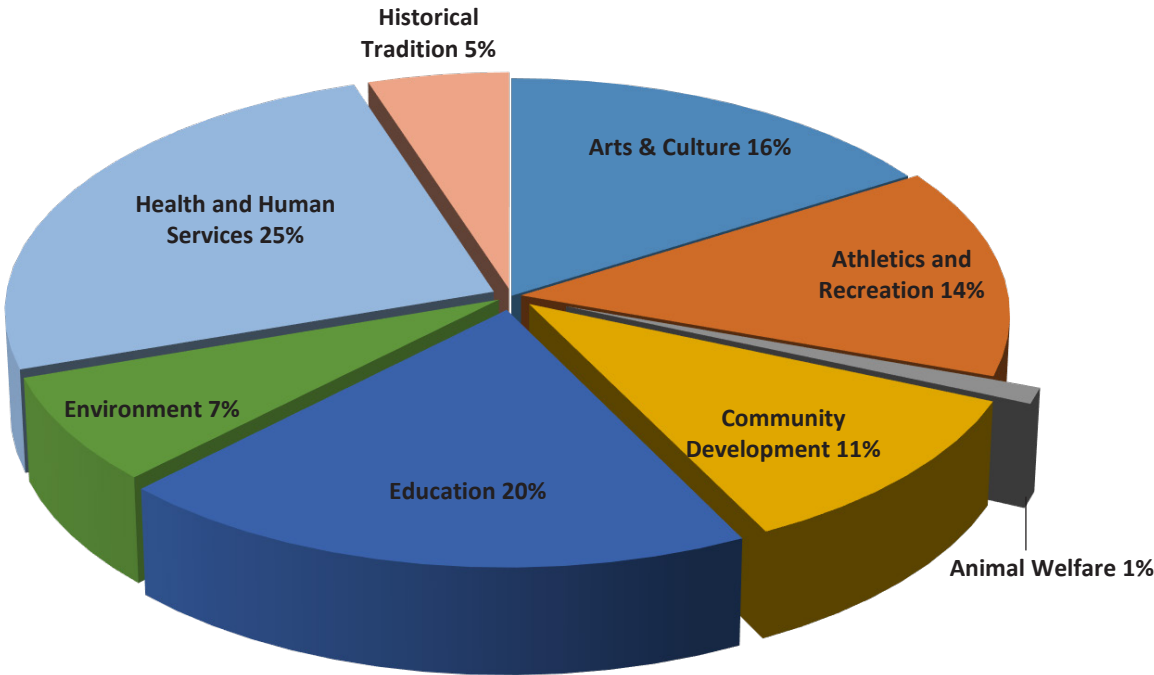

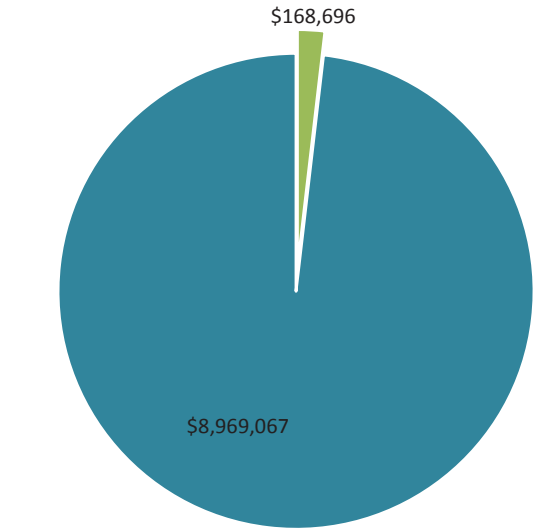
