

The Gunnison Valley COVID-19 Recovery Fund has granted \$428,586 to 28 different nonprofit organizations and community programs through ten rounds of funding:

### **CENTER FOR MENTAL HEALTH - \$10,000**

To provide counseling for people who have lost their jobs or don't have access through health insurance

# **CITY OF GUNNISON - \$28,089**

To provide free meals to local seniors through the Senior Meals program through December (part of Emergency Food Network grant)

## **CRESTED BUTTE FILM FESTIVAL - \$1,500**

To cover half the cost of the "unlock fees" to make the film LIV available to the public for free

#### **CRESTED BUTTE STATE OF MIND - \$10,000**

To provide teletherapy to help address the rising demand for mental health services; to provide scholarships for ten therapy sessions for community members needing support without the financial means to cover expenses

## CRYSTAL RIVER VALLEY NONPROFIT FOOD CO-OP - \$3,000

To expand Marble Charter School's food program for kids in need to those children's families, making fresh, local produce and nutritious meals available

### **GUNNISON ARTS CENTER - \$5,000**

To work with the Center for Mental Health to develop and administer a collection of art classes and activities that will help participants understand their emotions and learn new tools and techniques for coping and moving forward

### **GUNNISON COUNTRY FOOD PANTRY - \$17,900**

To provide food for urgently needed relief in Somerset, CO (\$1,000); to continue meeting the growing need to help feed hungry families countywide (\$2,000); to provide seven kid-friendly suppers each week to 50 families in extreme poverty. This effort compliments breakfast and lunches already provided by the school district (\$2,400); for the newly-formed Emergency Food Network (comprised of eight local organizations working on hunger relief) to advertise details of food opportunities up and down Valley for anyone in need of food assistance (\$3,500); to help with the purchase of a new free-standing walk-in freezer (part of Emergency Food Network grant) (\$9,000)

### **GUNNISON COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES - \$84,500**

To assist local individuals and families with rent, utilities, and other basic needs (five awards were made possible through partnerships with the Gunnison Valley Regional Housing Authority and the Rocky Mountain Health Foundation) (\$76,000); to provide 15,000 surgical face masks to meet safety and protection needs for front-line medical staff and volunteers (\$7,500); to provide grocery store gift cards for low-income individuals and families whose food benefits have been expended before the end of the month (part of Emergency Food Network grant) (\$1,000)



### **GUNNISON COUNTY SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION PROJECT - \$5,000**

For a peer-developed program to offer young people who request it access to two free, confidential wellness sessions with a mental health provider

## **GUNNISON HINSDALE EARLY CHILDHOOD COUNCIL - \$36,950**

To provide coverage for sick leave for local daycare/preschool staff who do not have access to paid sick leave (made possible through a partnership with the City of Gunnison)

### **GUNNISON VALLEY ANIMAL WELFARE LEAGUE - \$3,000**

To continue providing pet supplies, shelter, veterinary care and spay/neuter assistance for those impacted by COVID-19.

### **GUNNISON VALLEY HEALTH - \$15,976**

To connect isolated Senior Care Center residents with loved ones via iPads and to increase community access to the Hospital's Peer Support Specialists for folks struggling with mental health, psychological trauma or substance abuse (\$6,700); to provide mental health resources to Senior Care Center residents who have been isolated in their rooms (\$3,276); to provide 39 meals to 21 of our community's lowest-income senior citizens in partnership with the City of Gunnison Senior Center (\$4,000)

#### **GUNNISON VALLEY HEALTH FOUNDATION - \$80,000**

To assist in the creation of a Mobile Crisis Response Team to aid community members experiencing a mental health crisis and keep them out of the Emergency Room

### **GUNNISON VALLEY MENTORS - \$4,000**

To provide remote mental health services for at-risk youth while isolated at home

### **GUNNISON WATERSHED SCHOOL DISRICT RE1J - \$10,500**

To continue providing daily breakfast and lunch to local school children (\$4,000); to provide scholarship and tuition assistance at Lake School (made possible through a partnership with the City of Gunnison) (\$6,500)

## **GUNNISON & CRESTED BUTTE FARMERS MARKETS - \$900**

To provide Double-Up bucks to match SNAP benefits at both farmers markets (part of Emergency Food Network grant)

## **HISPANIC AFFAIRS PROJECT - \$18,000**

For rent, utilities or other basic needs of Gunnison County immigrants who have lost their jobs and do not have access to unemployment or federal stimulus monies (two awards were made possible in partnership with the Gunnison Valley Regional Housing Authority and the Rocky Mountain Health Foundation)

## **KBUT COMMUNITY RADIO - \$2,000**

To provide on-air question-and-answer sessions with public health personnel to keep residents and visitors informed on the latest local COVID news



## **LIGHTHOUSE PREGNANCY CENTER - \$2,250**

To purchase diapers, formula, and other needed supplies for low-income pregnant women and their newborns

#### **LIVING JOURNEYS - \$11,960**

To provide free food boxes and prepared meals for local cancer patients through December (part of Emergency Food Network grant)

## **MARBLE CHARTER SCHOOL - \$1,000**

To provide food for 14 low-income families in need of assistance in the Town of Marble

#### **MOUNTAIN ROOTS FOOD PROJECT - \$50,061**

To provide meals for the parents of school children who are receiving food on weekends (\$2,840); to serve 380 meals to 95 families unable to make ends meet because of the COVID crisis (\$5,670); to provide food to those in need through pop-up markets in high-need neighborhoods and home delivery of fresh food boxes (\$10,000); to continue to provide Free Markets through October 2020 and fresh food boxes through December (part of Emergency Food Network grant) (\$24,051); to continue to provide fresh produce to the community through October 2021 (\$7,500)

#### PROJECT HOPE OF THE GUNNISON VALLEY - \$4,500

To provide rental and utility assistance as well as shelter and transitional housing expenses for victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and human trafficking

### **SIX POINTS EVALUATION & TRAINING - \$5,000**

To meet the need for increased services for Six Points clients during the Coronavirus pandemic when group support and social interaction in the community are not available

#### TENDERFOOD CHILD & FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CENTER - \$10,000

To provide scholarship and tuition assistance (made possible through a partnership with the City of Gunnison)

#### **WESTERN COLORADO UNIVERSITY - \$5,000**

To supply face coverings for 1,000+ students returning to campus for the Fall 2020 semester
