

ABOUT THIS GUIDE: READ FIRST!

This is NOT a directory of all services in the Gunnison Valley. It IS a guide for people trying to make ends meet. And it IS also intended to be valuable for certain groups who have special challenges (not all of them economic) as they navigate the community.

Therefore, the Guide is organized to include both "Resources for Anyone" and "Resources for Specific Populations."

We focus on in-person resources in the Gunnison Valley; we include a few nearby if they're important but not offered here; and we include a very few online resources if they address emergencies such as a suicide/crisis hotline

In the Appendix, you'll find a Recovery Resource List for People in Recovery. This list also includes many valuable online resources.

This Guide can be found in print and online. The online version is searchable and available in both Spanish and English. It may be useful to search the online version for "Spanish" because many organizations have Spanish-speakers on their staff. **Online:** https://cfgv.org Resource Library > Community.

Some final thoughts:

- Inclusion in the Guide should not be considered to be our endorsement.
- Space is limited, so we don't list individual practitioners, most for-profit businesses, and most community events unless they directly address the purposes of this Guide.
- For "Connection," "Volunteering" or "Youth Activities" for anyone, we provide only a small sampling of what's available to demonstrate the diversity of options to choose from.
- Similarly, for "Connection" for specific populations we have highlighted a few individuals (like the Veterans Services Officer) or groups (like Inmigrantes Unidos de Gunnison) which might be a good starting place
- We don't always list addresses, as some groups don't have public offices or prefer to be contacted via the website.
- The Guide was accurate as of March 2025. But since hours and federal funds are subject to change, we suggest you call before you visit.
